What Requests Can and Cannot Be Supported?

Typical activities that can be supported by units include, but not limited to:

- Tutoring
- Mentoring
- Military exhibits
- Assist with student projects
- Career shadowing
- Guest speaker
- Reading to students
- Teach a course based on specific Military Occupational Specialty

- Field Day Support (will require review based on support needed)

Typical activities that WILL NOT be approved and Soldier should not perform include, but not limited to:

- Ushers
- Guards
- Messengers
- Parking attendants
- Maintenance
- Bag handlers
- Escorts for pageants or similar events
- Security activities
- Judging project/grading
- Serve as disciplinarians
- Loan equipment that the school could have contracted from local vendors
- Provide readily available equipment or supplies such as ice, food, cups, etc.
- Provide official vehicles to transport students to extracurricular events.
- Supplement the school's budget with regular ready supply of free labor.
