Get Your Child to Listen

(It's not as hard as you might think!)

GOOD BEHAVIOR

When we observe our children behaving the way we want them to (being kind, playing nicely, sharing their things, etc.) we often don't say anything because we don't want to interrupt the moment.

This is actually a great opportunity to stop and offer praise for what they are doing.

It lets them know they are doing well.

Bringing attention to what they are doing right helps reinforce those behaviors. **Praise loudly** and make it fun to help celebrate

their success!

When your child is in need of correction, take the time to interrupt and show them with your displeased (but not harsh) face, that this behavior is not acceptable.

Make good eye contact and use a low, non-threatening voice when you speak.

Correct quietly and redirect your child to the behavior you would prefer to see instead. This will help them make a better choice now and in the future.
