VOLUNTEERING AT FORT BRAGG

Each day, thousands of dedicated individuals share their time and energy by volunteering on military installations around the world.

Fort Bragg is very fortunate to have an exceptional volunteer corps who are able to share their skills, professional knowledge and time. The result is a strong network of experienced volunteers - a network which is vital to the overall success of Fort Bragg Experienced volunteers will tell you that volunteering does not require high level of education, years of experience, or specialized knowledge. It only requires a DESIRE TO HELP. If you don't know where you want to volunteer, we'll work with you to place you in an opportunity that not only works with the needs of an agency, but more importantly, what works with YOUR needs and interests.

Volunteers come from all segments of our population. Anyone can volunteer - active duty Soldiers, Family members, retirees, and youth. Volunteers are a crucial and essential part of the programs and services provided to our Soldiers and Family members.

More than 6,000 registered volunteers contribute thousands of hours of service to the installation each year. The Installation Volunteer Services office and the Army Volunteer Corps Coordinator (AVCC) are at the center of installation volunteer management to include recruitment, placement, tracking of hours, training, and recognition.

In addition, the AVCC serves as an information source for commanders, SFRGs, organizations and volunteers.

The Installation Volunteer Advisory Council (IVAC) consists of a representative from each volunteer agency. The council works with the AVCC to address volunteer issues and ensure the best possible working environment. The IVAC members are key players in the overall success of the installation volunteer program.

What's new and important for you to know? Fort Bragg units/organizations are now online with the Department of Army Volunteer Management Information System (VMIS), a world-wide, web-based volunteer tracking system which allows volunteers to track their own time, create résumés using volunteer experience, and manage their data from anywhere in the world. Unit/organization points of contact (OPOCs) for the system are trained monthly and available to assist with registration and logging of hours as needed.

Incentives are now in place for those volunteers who log their hours monthly such as lapel pins and other items!

Registration is Quick, Easy and Required!

- Visit... https://vmis.armyfamilywebportal.com to register in VMIS;
- Select "Dashboard" on the left hand navigation menu.
- Under the "MyVolunteering" section, the "Log Hours" table contains a list of your active positions with boxes to enter your hours for each day of the week.
- Please note the DA 4162 (Volunteer Service Agreement) is no longer required because the form is generated through VMIS.
- Complete the DD 2793 (Volunteer Agreement) - a separate one must be completed for each volunteer job in statutory activities.
- You must enter your time in VMIS by the 5th of the month for your OPOC to certify by the deadline.
- Your hours are important to the installation program to ensure continued program funding!

Why is Registration Important/Required?

- Legally, you cannot perform ANY volunteer work without the proper/current registration.
- It protects you and your unit/organization if you are injured while performing your volunteer duties.
- Provides information to command on volunteer activity on the installation.
- With the web system, your information travels with you when you PCS.
- Registration and documentation of hours is the starting point for all installation level and higher awards approval/processing.
