- f. It is a parental responsibility to provide for the appropriate level of supervision of their children. This policy uses age and education level of the child as the primary factor in establishing an appropriate minimum level of supervision. However, the parent must use good judgement and common sense in deciding whether the child's maturity and ability to care for one's self dictates a greater degree of supervision.
- g. A violation of this policy will be referred to the Case Review Committee, in accordance with AR 608-18, the Family Advocacy Program, paragraph 2-3, 30 October 2007, for a determination as to whether the circumstances constitute child neglect. In addition, parents may face administrative and/or punitive action for child neglect.
