Army Emergency Relief

AER promotes financial readiness and helps relieve distress of Soldiers and their Families by providing grants, interest-free loans, emergency travel and scholarships.

AER provides assistance for more than 30 categories of assistance including:

- **Basic Living Expenses** - Utilities, mortgage, rent, initial deposits, minor home repairs, PCS moves and more.
- **Vehicle** - Payments, insurance and repairs.
- **Healthcare** - Dental and medical expenses, and cranial helmets for children.
- **Food Insecurities**

Eligibility:

- Active duty Soldiers, single or married, and their eligible dependents.
- Army National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers on active duty for more than 30 consecutive days, and their eligible dependents.
- Army National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers who are retired and receiving DFAS Retired Pay, and their eligible dependents.
- Surviving Spouses and orphans of Soldiers who died while on active duty or after they retired.
