MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Animal registrations for On-Post Housing

1. Registrations are completed in person Monday through Wednesday 0900 – 1400 at the Fort Bragg Veterinary Center (VETCEN), or you can request the forms to be emailed to you directly.
2. Previous vet records are required in order to process registrations unless the animal is a puppy/kitten or has been seen within three years at another military facility. Records and registration documents can be emailed to dha.bragg.womack-amc.mbx.vet-clinic-pet-registration@health.mil.
3. Please allow up to 48 hours to in-process registration documents and complete your housing memorandum. Memorandums can be picked up in person after that time if you meet housing requirements. Your pets are not registered with Corvias until a housing memo has been issued and you have turned it into your housing community.
4. Please see attached document for housing requirements for all pets residing on post. There is a 30-day window from the time you move into housing to be in compliance with all requirements, with the exception of puppy/kitten boosters. Due to availability at the Fort Bragg VETCEN, you may have to seek care off-post and turn in required documents to receive the housing memorandum.

Dogs

Rabies Vaccine - \$17.00 per pet

Distemper / Parvo Vaccine - \$22.00 per pet

Lepto - \$22.00 per pet

Microchip - \$31.00

Fecal Test - \$28.00 per pet *Please bring fresh fecal sample no more than 12hrs old.*

Heartworm Test - \$36.00 per pet *Required for dogs annually 9months old and older.*

Cats

Rabies Vaccine - \$25.00 per pet

FVRCP (Feline Distemper) - \$22.00 per pet

Microchip - \$31.00

Fecal Test - \$28.00 per pet *Please bring fresh fecal sample no more than 12hrs old.*

There is a Wellness Exam fee of \$45.00 per pet and a \$2.00 user fee on each invoiced transaction. If you forget to purchase something after you have checked out, you will be charged the \$2.00 user fee again.

**If the ONLY requirement missing for housing is a fecal test, an appointment is not necessary. An appointment is only required if the fecal test is positive in order to dispense medications and/or another test or vaccine is needed.

MEMORANDUM FOR All Veterinary Medical Center (VETCEN)

Clients SUBJECT: Fort Bragg VETCEN Policy Letter

1. VETCEN ACCESS:

a. Only Active Duty, Reserves, 100% Disabled Veterans, Retirees, Dependents, and Medal of Honor Recipients are eligible for veterinary services at the Fort Bragg Veterinary Medical Center. GS civilians are no longer authorized care for health certificates to include pre-screening and the actual health certificate appointment.

b. In accordance with AR 40-905 Chapter 3-4 paragraph veterinary services will not be provided in support of any commercial operation breeding or raising animals (pets or livestock) for profit. Unintentional pregnancies will be handled according to proper medical treatment. A memorandum may be required stating the owner will not receive financial compensation for the litter and/or will have the pet spayed/neutered.

2. REGISTRATION AND RECORDS:

a. Registrations are completed in person Monday through Wednesday 0900-1400 at the Fort Bragg Veterinary Center (VETCEN), or you can request the forms to be emailed to you directly.

(1) Required items include:

(a) Valid US Armed Forces ID card.

(b) Current vaccination records.

(2) Registration will not take place without current vaccination records.

(3) Please allow 48hours for processing of registrations.

(a) All animals living on-post must be registered with Corvias housing, regardless of where the animal receives its veterinary care. It is the owner's responsibility to familiarize themselves with Corvias' Pet Policy and restricted breeds policy. Registration for on-post pets consists of current vaccines, a valid rabies certificate, microchip, fecal parasite test, and a heartworm test (dogs only).

Dogs must be on monthly heartworm prevention. These services can be obtained on or off post at the discretion of the owner. Off post records will not be maintained by the VETCEN but will be used to verify the animal's status for the housing office.

(b) It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the pet's vaccinations and medical status are kept current.

(c) To transfer ownership of a pet, the previous owner must inform VETCEN staff in person of the ownership change. Until a transferred pet is registered under the new owner's name, the previous owner remains legally and financially responsible for all costs associated with the pet.

(d) Owners are responsible for the transfer of any of their pet's hardcopy medical records during a PCS, ETS, or change of ownership. The sponsor/owner may sign out records.

(e) North Carolina law dictates that all pets over four months of age must be vaccinated for rabies. If a patient is seen at the Fort Bragg VETCEN and is not up to date on rabies, they will be vaccinated at their appointment.

(f) To surrender ownership of a pet who lives on-post, an owner surrender form must be filled out by the owner and stamped by the VETCEN prior to transporting the pet to Cumberland County Animal Service. The VETCEN does not take in surrendered pets. All pets must be taken to Cumberland County Animal Service by the owner with the signed and stamped form to be surrendered.

3. APPOINTMENTS:

a. The Fort Bragg VETCEN's primary mission is as follows:

(1) Provide comprehensive veterinary medical care to Military Working Dogs stationed in the Fort Bragg area.

(2) Protect the public from diseases potentially transmissible from animals to humans through vaccination and disease surveillance.

(3) Provide medical care for privately owned animals.

(4) Assist transitioning personnel through issuance of health certificates.

b. All pets are seen by appointment only. Please arrive at least 10 minutes prior to your scheduled appointment to allow time for check-in.

c. Payment is due upon completion of services. We accept cash, check, and credit cards (Visa, Discover, and MasterCard only) for payment. Any returned checks will incur a returned check fee of \$30.00 and you will no longer be allowed to use checks as a form of payment at this facility. There is a \$2.00 user fee, mandated by law, for every visit during which a sale of a product or service is recorded. The user fee funds are deposited in the United States Treasury.

d. All pets must be on a leash or in a carrier for patient and client safety. There are no exceptions to this policy.

e. All pets being seen for a euthanasia must be examined by a veterinarian to determine if euthanasia is recommended, and the required euthanasia paperwork must be filled out prior to the owner's departure. The veterinarian is an advocate for your pet(s) by ensuring all alternatives are exhausted before euthanasia. It is at the owner's discretion if they want to stay for the euthanasia after the exam and paperwork are completed, if euthanasia is the decision agreed upon.

4. NO SHOW/LATE POLICY:

a. Due to our high caseload and limited appointment availability, you must cancel appointments you cannot keep at least 24 hours before their appointment time. Failure to do so deprives others of needed appointment times. If there is an emergent situation, please let us know so we can work with you. Since the VETCEN has a wait list for surgery slots, one no show for a scheduled surgery will result in being removed from the surgical wait list for 6 months.

b. Arriving 10 minutes late to a scheduled appointment will result in a no show. Pending staff availability, you may still be able to be seen or rescheduled later in the day. Same day cancelations are considered no-show appointments. Those who no show 3 times or more within 6 months will be placed on a 6-month suspension from the VETCEN. To regain access to the clinic, you must reach out to the clinic after your 6-month suspension.

5. CHILDREN IN THE FACILITY:

a. Children in the Fort Bragg VETCEN must be supervised at all times for their safety. If your child is unsupervised, you will be asked to leave and reschedule your appointment.

b. The VETCEN is a hazardous place; if you bring your children, you do so at your own risk.

c. Do not leave unsupervised children in the parking lot or the waiting room.

d. You will be responsible for any damages created by your children.

6. PRESCRIPTIONS/MEDICATIONS:

a. In accordance with federal law, prescription medications will not be dispensed without a valid veterinarian-client-patient-relationship (VCPR). This requires that the pet be seen at the Fort Bragg VETCEN within the past 12 months and have a current medical record.

b. Refills for prescription medications require at least 48 hours' notice.

c. Upon refilling a prescription, it is the client's responsibility to pick up the prescription within 7 calendar days. Prescriptions that are not picked up within this time frame will be returned to inventory.

d. Heartworm prevention for animals over 8 months of age will only be dispensed with written proof of a negative heartworm test performed within the last 12 months.

7. RESPECT/PROFANITY:

a. During your visit to the Veterinary facility please practice the utmost respect as we will treat you as a valued and dignified client. This helps build trust and significantly improves the stress and anxiety that your animal may be feeling.

b. Any client who uses profanity, abusive language, or exhibits disrespect toward any member of the Fort Bragg VETCEN staff will be asked to leave the facility immediately and will no longer be authorized services.
