



West point Strong Beginnings Pre-K Program



The Army's Child, Youth and Services' Strong Beginnings pre-kindergarten program is designed for 4- to 5-year-old children. The program prepares young students for school with lessons in everything from science and technology to arts and life skills. Along with the basics of kindergarten skills, Strong Beginnings also teaches math, social studies, beginning reading and writing skills and good manners. The program, which is a full day program, five days a week, provides an educational program for children entering kindergarten in the fall. The program provides all meals (breakfast, lunch, and snack), social and emotional learning, and two opportunities a day for fine motor skills. The program caregivers allow the chance for parent-teacher conferences three times a year. Strong beginnings conducts a formal Graduations ceremony to close out the year and honor each child's accomplishments. The caregivers are exceptional in the Strong Beginnings classrooms and the curriculum implemented is targeted to support both individual and group development. The Strong Beginnings program is designed to offer each child a jump start to school and ensuring they are fully prepared for kindergarten.



Children ages 4-5 years old registered with CYS Services are eligible to for the West Point Strong Beginnings Program. To register your child please log on to militarychild-care.com and request care.



The Strong Beginnings program, which is a kindergarten readiness program is a viable option for pre-k. Although Strong Beginnings program is an educations pre-k program it is still classified as "child care" as the program is facilitated from 0600-1730hrs daily.
